The 2021 Toowoomba Royal Show proved to be one of the most successful events for the South Devon breed to date. Not only did the South Devon breed have one of the largest breed representations at the Toowoomba Show, Jambili Radradra was placed 5th in the top 5 for the Junior Interbreed Competition out of approx. 20 other breeds. The junior interbreed competition was introduced to give the Calf and Junior Champions a chance to be acknowledged and rewarded. It is often known that the younger animals are overlooked when competing in the Open Interbreed competition against Senior Cattle. This category also gave us an opportunity to parade our cattle in front of a different audience for a second time. Callum McUtchen (age 9) and Radradra proved to be a popular combination winning bragging rights over his mother Kath and Quesada. Though Kath still maintains that she and 'Sardy' are the better team as they have more broad ribbons, this show season. This friendly family competition is known throughout the Qld Show Circuit, and it is often joked about during the judging, when one family member is placed above the other. This friendly banter used to be just between James and Kath, however it now extends to include their children.

We now look forward to attending Beef 2021 in Rockhampton early May. We would love to catch up with anyone planning on attending.

South Devons will be judged at 12 noon on Wednesday the 5th of May, Tammie Robinson is the lady who has been given the opportunity to Judge our Breed. There has been no word as yet as to whether the judging will be live streamed. We will be in Ring 6 and housed in the 'Dawson' Tent for those wishing to find us.

The challenge was a bit of group fun where the kids had a set time to present their allocated animal with only 6 items of their choice.
